

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF OPERATION CATCH THEM YOUNG

The undersigned incorporator(s) are individual(s) 18 years of age or older and adopt the following articles of incorporation to form a nonprofit corporation (Chapter 317A).

ARTICLE 1 - NAME

The name of this corporation shall be Operation Catch Them Young Nonprofit.

ARTICLE II - REGISTERED OFFICE ADDRESS

The place in Minnesota where the principal office of the corporation is to be located is at 1405 Silver Lake Rd NW Ste 201, New Brighton, MN.

ARTICLE III – MISSION AND PURPOSE

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes as specified in Section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, including for such purposes, the making of distributions of organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501© (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

The Mission and Purpose of this corporation are:

Mission:

- ❖ To provide resources and materials to schools and individuals that support and encourage the education of children and youth throughout Africa.

Purpose:

- ❖ To equip schools with building supplies, furniture, science equipment, computers and access to clean drinking water.
- ❖ To create housing for homeless children and youth and provide them access to education.
- ❖ To provide children and youth with future resources that will help them gain access to higher education.

ARTICLE IV – EXEMPTION REQUIREMENTS

At all times the following shall operate as conditions restricting the operations and activities of the corporation:

1. No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purpose set forth in the purpose clause hereof.

2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall constitute the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, or any initiative or referendum before the public, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including by publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.

3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding section of any future tax code, or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170©(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future tax code

ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP/BOARD OF DIRECTORS

This corporation shall have members. The eligibility, rights and obligations of the members will be determined by the organization's bylaws.

The management of the affairs of the corporation shall be vested in a board of directors, as defined by the corporation's bylaws. No director shall have any right, title, or interest in or to any property of the corporation.


ARTICLE VII – DURATION/DISSOLUTION


